### New Mexico Council of Car Clubs - Minutes June 27, 2007 Meeting

Bob Agnew, Council President, called the meeting to order at 7:30 PM by asking if all present had received their newsletters. All answered in the affirmative.

Ron Rymarz, Treasurer, was asked for a Treasurer's Report. Ron reported that as of this date our checking account balance was \$6440.40.

Bob Agnew then asked if there were any guests present and we had two that wished to speak with council members. Matthew Monjaras, a representative from the Talking Talons Youth Leadership Group, and Carl Garcia, an inspector with the Albuquerque Zoning Department.

Matthew Monjaras spoke first talking about the Talking Talons Group and their "Wildfest 2007" event which will be held on July 21, 2007 at the Roosevelt Middle School in Tijeras on Route 337 (old South 14). This event will feature a wide variety of activities including a car show, games, music, food, animals, and more. Matthew invited all those present to come out and join in on the fun. And if you have a cool car bring it along as well. For further information about this event call 281-1133.

Carl Garcia of City Zoning spoke next about vehicles parked or stored on residential properties in Albuquerque. To keep from getting in trouble with the city ordinance concerning vehicles on private property he suggested that the owner keep up the appearance of vehicles and the property they are parked on to minimize complaints. His office is too busy to go out and randomly check on vehicles however they do have to respond to complaints. And if somebody complains about your property or your vehicles zoning will pay you a visit. He suggested that owners keep tires pumped up and they not remove parts like fenders, hoods, wheels, tires, and etc. so one doesn't get the idea that a vehicle is a parts car. If a vehicle is going to be taken apart he suggested that the vehicle be moved inside. If a vehicle is to be left outside and not driven on a regular basis he suggested that the vehicle be covered by a cover or a carport.

His talk was very informative and he also passed out copies of the city ordinance dealing with outside storage of vehicles on private property in Albuquerque. As an added bonus Carl gave out his direct number (924-3838) if people have any questions about the ordinance, fines, and the legal process one must go through if an owner doesn't take action once cited by zoning.

For Old Business we had two subjects to discuss at this meeting. The first was a car show report given by Joyce Clements concerning the Albuquerque Museum Car Show held in May. Joyce reported that the car show went off very well. She also brought along some unclaimed awards from the show for winners to take home.

Our second topic of discussion under the category of Old Business was the Volunteers Luncheon which will be held at the Village Pizza Shop in Corrales on July 15, 2007. Joyce had a list of names of people who volunteered and helped out at the Albuquerque Museum Car Show and asked for the names of any other volunteers who helped that were not already listed.

Our next item of discussion under New Business was the Great American Car Race that will be making an overnight stop at the new Embassy Suites Hotel at I-25 and Lomas. The vehicles are to arrive at the hotel around 5:00 PM on July 10, 2007 and Bob Agnew suggested that the Car Council and it's member clubs show up to give this group a proper welcome to our city. Tentative plans call for us to give out water, cookies, and hosting an ice cream social for all the participants.

Joyce Clements made a motion that the car council spend a reasonable and proper amount of money to do a bang up job in welcoming this group to our city. This motion was voted on and passed unanimously.

Our next subject was the All Clubs Picnic scheduled for Villanueva State Park on August 5, 2007. The Rickshaws, our host club, brought us up to date on all the latest details. Their club representatives said they need volunteers to help cook the hot dogs and hamburgers and they would like volunteers to bring side dishes. Also needed are plastic ware (forks, spoons, and knives), plates, napkins and etc.

At this point all discussion stopped and the meeting was brought to a close.
